## **5. SCHOOL BUS DANGER ZONES**

The danger zone is the area on all sides of the bus where students are in the most danger of being hit, either by another vehicle or their own bus. The danger zones may extend as much as 9 meters / 30 feet from the front bumper, 3 meters / 10 feet from the left and right sides of the bus and 3 meters / 10 feet behind the rear bumper of the school bus. In addition, the area to the left of the bus is always considered dangerous because of passing cars.
